Te Kakano (The Seed) – Te Hangahanga ki roto i te rohe o Pōkeno – Development in Pōkeno



- Development in Pōkeno has been ongoing for at least 20 years. In the last 10 years' development has increased tenfold
- The Pōkeno Community have had a voice in planning development thus far, however, the Māori voice has been absent.
- In February 2018 Mr Haupai Montgomery, and a collective of generational whanau who have lived in Pōkeno for decades, began the journey of becoming the Māori voice of Pōkeno.

Te Pihinga – (The Sprout) – Te Korokoro Tui o Pōkeno – The Māori Voice of Pōkeno

- Haupai Montgomery, Louis Whiunui, John Ngatai, Te Puawaitanga Matene, Cecilia Heta and Karen Heta were the initial group that began this journey as the Māori Voice of Pōkeno.
- Referred to as 'Te Korokoro Māori o Pōkeno', this rōpū of whānau planted the seed that grew the fruit for the Tui (Māori Community) enabling the Tui to sing.

"A marae in Pōkeno District, that supports all people."

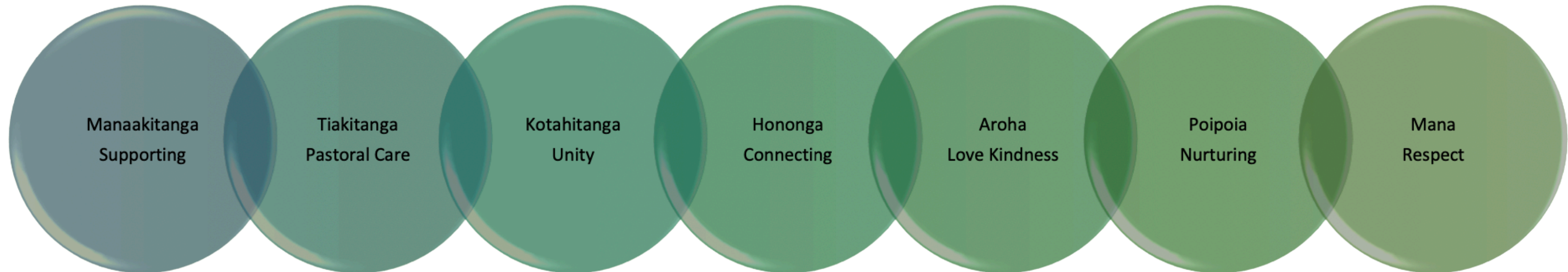


Tō Tātou Ūaratanga – Our Core Values

2018

- Te Korokoro Tui meet to discuss the Māori voice of Pōkeno.

2019

- Ongoing discussions with the wider Community of Pōkeno to add some traction to building a marae in Pōkeno.

2020

- June 14 – Committee Formed
- August 8 – Charitable Trust Status granted
- September 28 – Pookeno Community Committee give support to Te Hau Kainga
- October 28 – Seeking support from Ngāti Tamaoho
- November 10 – Letter sent to Kiingitanga Office seeking his support
